Indiana's Employability Skills Standards

Indiana's Employability Skills Standards allow students to be prepared for the everchanging needs of today's workforce. The standards are based on the National Employability Skill Standards from the Office of Career, Technical, and Adult Education (OCTAE), the Indiana Department of Workforce Development's Employability Skills Benchmarks, the Governor's Work Ethic Certificate, and the Indiana Department of Education's Social-Emotional Learning Competencies. The standards are arranged within four key areas: Mindsets (M), Work Ethic (WE), Learning Strategies (LS), and Social and Emotional Skills (SE).

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Success Bound

Success Bound is a curriculum for middle grade students to explore their identities and futures, expanding their outlook on postsecondary opportunities. The Success Bound curriculum helps students develop the mindsets, work ethic, learning strategies, and durable skills needed to succeed in middle school, high school, and beyond. The chart below demonstrates how Success Bound lessons align with Indiana's Employability Skills Standards across all units in each grade level.
